Welcome

• All members of the PTSA Board that were present introduced themselves to the general membership

Standard Items (Matt Hunt and Marika VanderSmith)

- Land Acknowledgement
- PTSA Overview
 - o An overview of the structure of the Bryant, Seattle and Washington PTSA organization was shared, as well as an overview of the Bryant PTSA's mission
- Review of Board Norms
 - o Previously agreed upon norms were presented that the co-Presidents recommend be adhered to this year:
 - We represent the interests of our students and community.
 - Speak up and share your opinion with respect.
 - Assume best intentions.
 - Be inclusive, welcoming, and have fun.
 - Board meetings are a focusted time for achieving clear decisions and next steps. Table issues needing more discussion.
 - Keep your responses brief and focused.
- Hispanic/Latinx Heritage Month
 - o Monthly theme related to the Bryant PTSA's Anti-Racist Commitment was presented
- What's Happening at Bryant
 - o Key dates for upcoming school events were reviewed
- Approval of Minutes
 - o Draft minutes of the June 2024 General Membership meeting are available on the Bryant PTSA website
 - o Anna Bonnett made a motion to approve the minutes of the June 2024 General Membership meeting as presented; David McKnight seconded the motion; the motion passed
- Approval of Revised Standing Rules
 - An overview of the proposed updates being made to the standing rules was presented, referring to the meeting materials (below). Updates were made to align to changes made to the Washington PTSA bylaws and to reflect current operational practice.
 - o Anna Bonnette made a motion to adopt the standing rules as presented to the membership; Michael Polin seconded the motion; the motion passed

Principal's Update (Dr. Marshall)

- The revised Well Resourced Schools proposal is now to close up to 5 schools for the 2024-2026 school year. Dr. Marshall expects that this will result in no large scale boundary changes or significant impacts to Bryant.
- Curriculum Night was well attended and teachers are able to provide handouts/information to any families
 that may not have been able to attend. 2nd grade curriculum night will occur once Ms. Regalado returns
 from leave.
- The school is considering holding a fall harvest parent picnic. The school will also hold a Veteran's Day assembly on November 7, which parents are invited to attend
- October adjustments to budget/staffing have been done by the District. Bryant did not have any reductions
 or staffing shifts since our projected enrollment was very close to our actual enrollment in October
- The District is asking schools to focus on curriculum embedded assessments. Writing assessments will be delivered to all grade levels this year.

 LASER and Dr. Marshall collaborated on a change to LASER's safety policies which LASER will speak more about in its report

Laser Update (Marissa Kane and Kevin Stordahl)

- LASER noted that the program is well underway this year, with 180 students participating. LASER is excited it was able to retain a number of prior counselors. The K-3 classrooms are completely full with a waitlist and there is limited space in the 4th and 5th grade rooms. The first LASER camp day is Oct. 11 and there is space.
- Effectively immediately LASER will be locking the gates to the playground from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m. and all pickups will need to be processed at the LASER entrance. This change is being made due to a safety issue involving an unauthorized adult on the playground and LASER feels it is in the best interest of its students' safety.
- LASER noted that it has reached out to various community groups that use the playground to assess how to lock the playground with minimal impacts to the community. They have reached out to Mat Chess, Wunderkind and ASE. Based on their feedback, they will not lock the playground until 3 p.m. and will allow the playground to reopen for ASE pickup as needed.
- LASER stressed that they are trying to be as flexible as they can to allow joint use of the space by community
 groups while still protecting LASER student safety.
- The membership asked questions of LASER regarding the change, its impact to the surrounding neighborhood and other alternatives that were explored. Dr. Marshall noted that LASER's agreement gives it the right to sole use of the playground space after school and therefore can implement this new safety measure. She also shared that she is supportive of this change and feels it is in the best interest of student safety.

Teacher Updates (Alex Jones)

- Alex provided an update on the upcoming state in-service day for teachers and teacher support of the Annual Campaign
- The Staff would like to explore having more staff members CPR/AED certified and asked if PTSA funding would be available to support this initiative. Alex will submit additional information to the Board about potential cost
- The Staff is looking for a graphic designer who could volunteer some time to create a Playground Rules poster

President Updates (Matt Hunt and Marika VanderSmith)

- ASE sign ups have occurred, and fall classes are underway. Marika noted that we are aware there is
 opportunity to improve communicating the sign up deadline and that this will be a focus area for the next
 session of classes.
- The Annual Campaign is also about to launch. This is our biggest fundraiser and we appreciate the teachers help in promoting it.
- Currently about 10% of the community are dues paying PTSA members.
- All rooms (but potentially 1) have been assigned a room parent and a room parent toolkit has been distributed.

Treasurer's Updates (David McKnight and Maggie Dreifuerst)

- The Treasuers reviewed the approved budget for the year, referring to the meeting materials (below).
- The membership asked questions about how the Annual Fund donations are spent. The Treasurers explained that we fundraise for our sister school PTSA on an ad hoc basis. Individuals must opt in to provide funds to our sister school. It is not included as a line item in our budget.
- The membership also asked questions about the cap on PTSA funding. The Treasurers explained that we may only spend up to \$250,000 on certain PTSA funded expenses per school board policy. The Treasurers gave an overview of how the PTSA has historically chosen to allocate funds within the \$250,000 cap amount, noting that the principal and building leadership team typically make a proposal to the PTSA that is used as a starting point to craft the budget.

 The Treasurer team noted that the PTSA will be soliciting members for the budget committee later in the year and that volunteering for that committee is a great entry point for understanding the PTSA budgeting process.

Advocacy Updates (Leah Rutman)

- Leah was introduced as the new Advocacy Chair. She provided an update on the school district's Well Resourced Schools proposal, referring to the meeting materials (below). She noted that the original proposal to close 20+ schools has been abandoned and a new proposal will be forthcoming from the superintendent. Also, closing or changing the format of option schools is no longer being considered which likely means that the impacts to Bryant's boundaries will not be as significant (since Thorton Creek will remain an option school). It is also clear that although a smaller number of schools will be proposed for closure this year, more schools could close in subsequent years.
- Leah also noted that legislative advocacy is needed to increase school funding, which has been estimated to be underfunded by up to \$4 billion dollars. Writing the Governor and state legislatures to express your support for school funding is encouraged.
- Leah also noted that school levies will be on the ballot this year and explained the types of expenditures they
 can be used for.
- Going forward, the PTSA website will contain a landing page that will be updated frequently with information about the Well Resourced schools plan, school funding and other advocacy issues.

Fundraising Updates (Michael Polin)

• The Annual Campaign is set to start shortly. Participation will be key given the need for funding next year and the uncertainty regarding school closures. The recommended donation per child has remained consistent with last year (\$550 per child). The need to ensure all employer matching dollars are received was emphasized.

Art Committee Updates (Vanya Uzelac)

- The Art Committee provided an update on its activities, including its support of the Reflection Competition, the Artist in Residence Program, and the Family Art Night.
- Two new programs are also being supported this year. Art Adventures is a new PTSA funded program that
 will support teachers taking students into the community to visit museums or take part in other arts
 programming.
- The Creative Advantage program is also a new district program this year that is being implemented at the school. More information will be forthcoming on the program from the school.

Families in Need Updates (Nina Mettler)

- Nina reported that she is hoping to pull together a new committee to help support a number of related programs sponsored by the PTSA, including the Families in Need program and Hunger Service project. This new committee would also explore establishing other service opportunities for families.
- Nina also reported on the fact that we have more students who have expressed the need to have support from the Families in Need program than was originally budgeted for.

Volunteer Committee Updates (Anna Bonnett and Kelly King French)

• The Volunteer Coordinators walked through the key areas where PTSA volunteers are still needed, referring to the meeting materials (below). They noted that not all volunteer roles require SPS volunteer clearance.

• Anna moved to adjourn, David seconded. Motion passed.

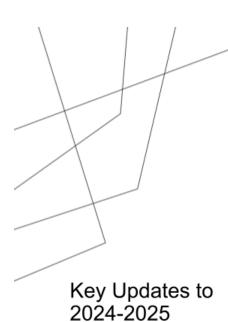

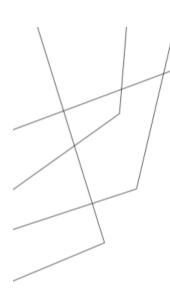

Standing Rules

- Updated rules to incorporate required amendments to align to WA PTSA bylaws
 - Added provision that makes clear that Bryant PTSA may not serve as a fiscal agent or fiscal sponsor of any outside organization
 - Added provision that specifies the procedure for revoking a member's membership
 - Clarified that Executive Officers may only serve 2 consecutive terms in the same office and that an officer serving more than 8 months in an office is considered to have served a term in that office
 - Clarified that meetings may be held virtually
- Added Operations Co-Chairs as a members of the Board
- Clarified that each individual holding a co-officer/co-chair position is entitled to one vote at Board or Executive Committee meetings
- Clarified that only the co-Presidents and Lead Treasurer are authorized signers on the Bryant PTSA bank accounts
- Clarified that the Executive Committee can approve expenditure of unallocated funds up
 to \$100; the Board can approve expenditure of unallocated funds up to \$5,000; and the
 General Membership must approve expenditure of unallocated funds of \$5,000 or more.
 All must be approved by majority vote.
- Clarified that the Board may authorize reallocation of up to \$5,000 from one budgeted purpose to another; and the General Membership may authorize reallocation of \$5,000 or more from one budgeted purpose to another. All must be approved by ²/₃ vote.
- Added the ability of the General Membership to re-allocate funds from a restricted account to the Bryant PTSA's general funds via a majority vote
- Updated location that Bryant PTSA corporate records are stored to reflect that key documents are no longer stored in hard copy in the Bryant Library



President Updates

- After School Enrichment is up and running!
- A big "Thank You" to the entire Bryant community for your support and engagement around the recent Well-Resourced Schools plan.
 We will keep everyone apprised of developments.
 - Leah Rutman has volunteered to help guide our advocacy efforts.
- 104 current PTSA members. Approximately 11% of the caregiver community.
- One Room Parent in place for each classroom, with the exception of one (close to final).
- The Room Parent Toolkit has been completed and distributed and Room Parent kickoff meeting was held on September 26.

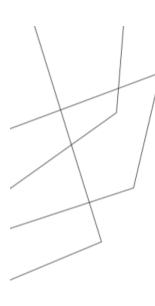

- SPS plans: New plan to propose consolidating five schools.
- K-12 education funding issues: SPS has an approximately \$100M budget gap, and WA. apparently underfunds K-12 education by approximately \$4 billion.

What You Can Do/Resources?

SPS level:

- Attend SPS meetings. If inclined, attend related rallies.
- o E-mail SPS board and the Superintendent.
- Use "Let's Talk."
- Engage in the levies work.
- Connect with parent advocacy groups.

Legislature level

- E-mail your State Representatives, Senators, and the Governor.
- Ask for meetings with lawmakers, potentially as groups of parents.
- Connect with parent advocacy groups.
- Sign-up for WA PTA's action alerts.
